

- 20* *glaucophylla* Species. Lovely pink/purple small pitcher shaped flowers on a climbing/scrambling plant with leaves which are glaucous on the reverse.
- 21 *heracleifolia* mixture Hybrids. Upright self-supporting plants to 4ft. with scented hyacinth like flowers, from white through to purple. Unusual and lovely.
- 22 Herbaceous mixture Hybrids. A wide selection from a range of herbaceous plants, from short to tall, upright to climbers, in a range of colours.
- 23* *hirsutissima* Species. Gorgeous purple, quite hairy urns, on an upright, plant to about 1 ft, or slightly more. Intricately cut leaves are frequent on this plant, which is alpine in nature, and quite challenging to grow. One for the real enthusiast, rare and very choice. Flowering in Spring and sometimes into Summer.
- 24 *ianthina* var. *kuripoensis* Species. Striking purple pitchers, which can be covered with hair, nearly 2 inches long, on a plant with attractive foliage, to about 7 ft. This is a plant well worth growing.
- 25 *ianthina* var. *kuripoensis* BSWJ700 Species. Striking purple pitchers, very lightly covered with hair, up to 2 inches long, on a strong plant with attractive foliage, to about 8 ft. This is a plant well worth growing.
- 26 *ianthina* mixture Hybrids. A wide selection from a range of herbaceous plants, from short to tall, upright to climbers, in a range of colours. Mixture. Medium small pitchers, usually in purple, sometimes with a light fluff of brown hairs, on herbaceous scramblers to 7 – 10 ft.
- 27 *integrifolia* (best blue) Selection. Collected from the best blue flowering plants. Small pendant bells. Herbaceous, and usually growing to 2 - 3 ft.
- 28 *integrifolia* (white) Selection. Collected from the best white flowering plants. Small pendant bells. Herbaceous, and usually growing to 2 - 3 ft.
- 29 *integrifolia* dwarf types Species variant. Pendulous recurving bells, on herbaceous, multi stemmed plants to around 2 ft.
- 30 *integrifolia* hybrids Hybrids. A collection of seed from various hybrids, where *integrifolia* is one parent. A range of colours, shapes and sizes.
- 31 *integrifolia* mixture Mixture. Many variants of the type plant, in different sizes colours and shapes. Herbaceous, and usually growing to 2 - 3 ft.
- 32 *intricata* mixture Mixture. A selection from a range of plants, mostly with orange to red bells with strong purple/brown markings. Hardy climbers to 10 ft.
- 33 *ispahanica* Species. Small creamy flowers, but the seed heads are what this plant is really all about. A subshrub to around 6 ft.
- 34 *jouiniana* mixture Mixture. Hardy, shrubby scramblers, covered with numerous, white to pale mauve, open hyacinth like flowers. Strong growers to around 7 ft.
- 35 *kirilowii* Species. Small white open stars, somewhat reminiscent of a climbing version of *c. recta*, and often with net-veined leaflets. A deciduous climber to about 6 ft.
- 36 *koreana* mixture Hybrids. Beautiful recurving bells often with prominent 'shoulders' in a variety of colours and markings, blooming in Spring and often onwards.
- 37 *ladakhiana* Species. Smallish, pendulous, open bells in yellow/orange, often flushed with purple/reddish brown spots, with glaucous foliage to 8 – 10 ft.
- 38 Large Flowered Mixture Hybrids. A wide range of colours, some bi-colours, and even possibly double or semi-double large flowers, on plants of 6 ft. upwards.
- 38a *ligusticifolia* Species. Wild collected in the USA. A large plant with a profusion of tiny white stars, growing to around 20 ft. Rather like a refined version of our native *C. viticella*.
- 39 Lucky Dip Mixture. Stars, plates, bells, tubes, whatever, and in a cornucopia of colours! If you like living on the wild side, and taking a chance, this is the choice for you.
- 40 *macropetala* mixture Hybrids. Beautiful dancing open double bells, in a variety of colours with some bi-colours. Spring flowers on strong plants to 9ft.
- 41 *mandschurica* Species. Upright herbaceous plants with lots of small white star shaped, well scented flowers. Grows to around 5 ft.
- 42 *montana* mixture Hybrids. A selection from a good range of plants, small open cupped flowers from white to dark pink, on vigorous climbers, flowering in Spring.
- 43 *morefieldii* Species. A climbing plant with numerous small pinky green pendant flowers covered in fine pale hairs. The underside of the leaflets is covered in fine cobwebby hairs. Can grow to about 9 ft.
- 44 *napaulensis* Species. Cream bells with protruding purple stamens, blooming in midwinter. Given a bit of shelter, this can grow to 30ft.
- 45 NZ mixture Mixture. White to cream stars in Spring. Wide or narrow sepals on evergreen plants, often with nicely cut leaflets, just occasionally vestigial ones, growing from about 6 inches up to 12 ft high.
- 46* *occidentalis* Species. Open bells in late Spring on climbers to 6 ft. Blue, through violet, to rose-violet flowers. This is a more challenging plant than most atragenes.
- 47* *ochroleuca* Species. Greeny mauve nodding pitchers, flowering terminally on a short upright plant, suitable for alpine conditions. Somewhat challenging to grow, but very choice and rarely offered. Very short supply.
- 48 Orange/white/yellow mixture Hybrids. A wide ranging mixture from the orient, with lovely open bells or stars, on strong growing plants. Very floriferous, with attractive seed heads. Includes seed from 'Grace' and 'Sundance'
- 49* *orientalis* Species. Small, nodding, greenish yellow, recurved flowers, sometimes tinged with brown/purple, followed by good seedheads, on a climber to 12 ft.
- 50 *patens*— white wild collected Species. Collected in Japan, from plants with large flowers, growing to 6 ft. upwards. These seeds will frequently germinate in about 7 to 10 months, rather than the 18 to 24 months for the Large Flowered Hybrid seed.
- 51 *pitcheri* Species. Fascinating deeply grooved chunky pitcher shapes in purple to red on herbaceous plants. One for the collector!
- 52 *potanini* Species. Flat, delicate, whitish blooms with a yellow centre, in great profusion, on a strong scrambler which should easily make 15 ft.
- 53 *recta* Species. Growing on a herbaceous, upright plant to 3 – 5 ft. The white, star shaped flowers grow in profusion. Usually green or purple foliage.
- 54 *recta* 'Purpurea' Species variant. Growing on a herbaceous, upright plant to 3 – 5 ft. The white, star shaped flowers grow in profusion. Usually striking purple foliage.
- 55 *rehderiana* Species. With cowslip scented, pendulous, creamy yellow, reflex tipped, tubular bells on a vigorous plant to about 20 ft.
